Stay the night – or stay for a week – at the five-star Mains of Taymouth in Kenmore (www.taymouth.co.uk). Set in more than 160 private acres of forests, river

walks and scenic views over Loch Tay, this stunning selfcatering estate, which is home to the Menzies family, is the perfect base from which to explore Perthshire.

Mains of Taymouth also has its own golf course, which is widely considered one of central Scotland's finest nine-hole course. A destinations not to be missed.
